

Re: Post 16 Transition to education, employment, or training

Dear Parent or Carer

Now that your young person is in Year 11, they will be thinking about their options and what to do next. We wanted to provide you with some information that would help with this. They may have an offer of further education from a local college or sixth form, or they may be seeking an apprenticeship or other work-based training programmes.

Whichever pathway they are considering, there is some information they need to be aware of and we hope this letter helps with that. Below is a list of key documents they may need to have to move onto their next steps.

- ID (passport/birth certificate) Copy certificates Liverpool City Council
- Bank Account
- National Insurance Number https://www.gov.uk/lost-national-insurance-number
- Supporting school letter for ID
- CV
- Email Address a professional email address will be required


During Year 11, young people are encouraged to start as early as October to start looking and considering their next steps. This can include attending open days, looking at prospectuses online, talking through offers and expected grades. Part of this will include teachers, colleges and other professionals talking about expected grades or grade

The specific date for when applications need to be submitted vary depending on where they are hoping to go. It is advised that you check the websites of the colleges, sixth form, apprenticeships, or other providers.

They should try and apply as soon as possible as places may fill up. It is important they leave enough time to choose subjects carefully and pick others if needed so that they better suit their grades.
